

THOMAS STEWART FOUNDERS AWARD

Named in honor of Dr. Thomas Stewart whose vision, leadership, & support resulted in the creation of the NPUAP, this award honors an individual or group that has made a significant contribution to the prevention or management of pressure ulcers through leadership & public policy.

KOSIAK AWARD

Named in honor of Dr. Michael Kosiak for his seminal contributions on the etiology of pressure ulcers, this award recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions through their leadership in research, education or patient care related to pressure ulcer prevention & management. A \$1000 donation will be made to a scholarship fund designated by the awardee.

RESEARCH AWARD

NPUAP fosters & supports research on pressure ulcer prevention & treatment. A small grant award (\$1500) is made to a novice researcher from any health care or basic science discipline.
