



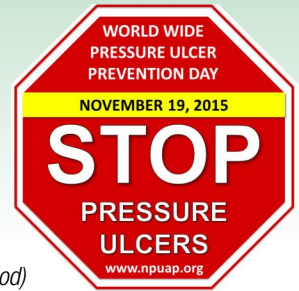

**Jeffrey Levine, MD** ■ Dr. Levine is a board certified internist and geriatrician with over thirty years of experience in wound care in hospitals, nursing homes, and home care environments. He is Assistant Professor of Medicine and Geriatrics at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, and has a hospital based wound care practice at the Center for Advanced Wound Care at Mount Sinai Beth Israel Medical Center in Manhattan. He received his fellowship training in geriatrics at Mount Sinai Medical Center where he began his interest in chronic wounds. Dr. Levine's professional focus is improving the quality of care delivered to elderly persons, particularly regarding wound care, and has published numerous articles on this topic. Dr. Levine believes that the science of medicine must be understood within its rich historical context. He is an elected board member of the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel (NPUAP).
